Package Contents

The following items should be in the box:

- e68 DAC
- Power supply (may be supplied separately)
- A-B USB cable
- IR Remote Control

Proper Device Placement

Place the device on a stable solid base, far from heat sources. Do not expose the device to direct sunlight. Allow at least 2.5 cm (1") around the device for ventilation. Do not place the device on fabrics, inside enclosed space, or in contact with curtains. Do not place the device on top of power amplifiers or any other equipment that emits heat. Do not expose the unit to smoke, humidity, moisture and water. Do not stack exaSound devices one on top of the other.

Keep the length of analogue interconnects and speaker cables short for optimal sonic performance. Remember that cables act as filters. Shorter cables have less impact on sonic performance. The shorter the cables, the more transparent they become.






Headphones accepts a standard 1/4-inch stereo single-ended phone plug. Use a suitable adapter for headphones equipped with a different plug.

Infrared Remote Control



Your unit is programmed to work with the supplied remote control.

The e68 DAC can be re-programmed to work with most infrared remote controls using Sony and NEC IR protocols, for example the Sony RM-EZ4 Universal Remote, or Apple remote control.


Using the e68 DAC with exaSound Streamers and Music Servers

- 1. The e68 DAC is ready for plug-and-play operation with exaSound streamers and music servers.
- 2. Connect the e68 DAC with your streamer or music server with the provided USB cable.
- 3. Follow the instructions for your exaSound streamers or music server.

Windows ASIO Driver Setup

- 1. Use the username / password that we've emailed you with the shipping confirmation email to login to <u>support.exasound.com</u>.
- 2. Download and unzip the latest exaSound Windows ASIO Driver.
- 3. Run *exaSound-N1-5-3-39-Setup.exe* (or later version) and follow the prompts. ASIO drivers step-by-step setup instructions are available in this guide.
- 4. Reboot your computer.
- 5. Setup your ASIO compatible player (Roon, J. River Media Center, HQPlayer etc.) to use the exaSound ASIO driver. Check the *Guides* section of the exaSound blog for step-by-step player configuration instructions: exasound.com/Blog.aspx.
- 6. Click on the *exaSound Dashboard* Icon next to the clock on the Windows System Tray and set the master volume.




- 1. Use the username / password that we've emailed you with the shipping confirmation email to login to support.exasound.com.
- 2. Download and install the latest **exaSound-OS-X-Drivers**. Step-by-step setup instructions are available in this guide.
- 3. When the installation is complete, your Mac will reboot. You will see the exaSound driver in the Audio MIDI Setup.
- 4. Select the exaSound driver in the settings window of your player application. Check the *Guides* section of the exaSound blog for step-by-step player configuration instructions:

- 5. The e68 DAC has an automatic power-on function and it will turn itself on when playback is started.

Features

The e68 DAC is based on the ES9038PRO reference DAC chip. It delivers 32-bit precision capable of resolving the smallest signal details. The chip features patented 32-bit HyperStream technology. ES9038PRO delivers the industry's highest performance levels that will satisfy the most demanding audio enthusiasts.

Windows ASIO Driver

Using ASIO brings unique advantages that are hard to achieve with other Windows driver technologies.

Mac OS High-Performance Driver

We offer a custom high-performance Mac OS driver supporting PCM sampling rates from 44.1kHz to 384kHz at 32bit resolution. We support DSD over PCM 1.0 standard at the following sampling rates: DSD64 (2.8224/3.072 MHz), DSD128 (5.6448/6.144 MHz) and DSD256 (11.2896/12.288 MHz).

Proprietary Mac ASIO driver offers DSD512 in Stereo Mode

ASIO brings unique capabilities to the MAC OS platform. exaSound's proprietary ASIO implementation is completely independent from the Core Audio sound system and always operates in Integer / Exclusive Mode. ASIO supports native DSD, while Core Audio drivers rely on the DoP workaround (DSD over PCM). ASIO is more efficient and causes a lower CPU load.

At this time our proprietary ASIO drivers on Mac are supported only by Roon and HQplayer 3.

Bit-perfect operation independent from the Windows volume control and mixer

The Windows volume control and mixer are optimized to provide wide compatibility and easiness of use. These features come at the expense of sonic fidelity. The resulting output may not be bit-perfect or bit-transparent.

Asynchronous USB mode eliminates jitter caused by the PC or the USB interface

Asynchronous USB is a two-way communication method between a computer and an external DAC. e68 controls the rate at which audio data is transmitted over USB. Rather than being sent as a continuous stream, as is the case with standard USB audio interfaces, the data is sent in packets. If a streaming error is detected, the faulty packet is retransmitted. Packet retransmission for error correction is possible because audio data is streamed at speed higher than the playback speed.

The incoming data is stored in a large memory buffer. The data is then clocked out of this buffer by the e68 high-precision master clock. Re-clocking guarantees a very high accuracy and precision of data timing. It completely eliminates jitter caused by computer timing errors and the USB data transport. An added bonus to using packet based streaming over USB is the ability to send and receive control information along with the audio data. This is how volume control instructions are exchanged between the e68 DAC and the computer/streamer.

Hardware Volume Control and Volume Bypass

The e68 DAC volume is controlled by the ES9038PRO DAC chip. It is completely independent from the Windows software volume control. Audio data is always bitstreamed over the USB interface at full scale 0db/32bit resolution. Volume processing is performed by the DAC chip right at the border between the

digital and the analogue domains. This architecture offers signal to noise ratio comparable to the best analogue volume controls. Setting the volume to 0dB turns all volume processing off and sets the e68 DAC in volume bypass mode.

Volume Control Integration with JRiver for Windows / JRemote and Roon

The exaSound Volume Synchronization Plug-ins allow JRiver for Windows, the JRemote app and Roon to access the hardware volume control built in all exaSound DACs.

On Mac OS the volume synchronization is implemented by the exaSound drivers and there is no need for using plug-ins.

Roon Tested



e68 is a Roon Tested DAC. It has been profiled and tested by both Roon Labs and exaSound for maximum compatibility. Roon recognizes exaSound devices and streams audio optimized for their capabilities. Together, Roon and exaSound deliver the power, flexibility, and performance benefits of digital audio, with the easiest setup and highest reliability available.

Connecting and Powering the e68 DAC



Before connecting, turn off the power to all the components in your system.

Connecting the Digital Inputs

All digital inputs are galvanically isolated to eliminate ground loop noise. The e68 DAC accepts three digital inputs:

- **USB** This is the recommended and most capable input. It supports PCM up to 32 bit/384 kHz and DSD up to 24.576 MHz/DSD512.
 - Connect the e68 DAC to your computer, compatible streamer or audio server using the supplied A-B USB cable. Most standard A-B USB cables with length up to 16 ft (5m) can be used.
- **SPDIF IN1** SPDIF Input, 75-ohm RCA. Supports 2 channels (Stereo) PCM up to 24 bit resolution at standard sampling frequencies from 44.1 kHz to 192 kHz.
- **SPDIF IN2** SPDIF Input, TOSLINK, Optical. Supports 2 channels PCM up to 24 bit resolution at standard sampling frequencies from 44.1 kHz to 96 kHz.

Connecting the Line Outputs

- Before making a connection make sure that your analogue power amplifier is powered down.
- **RCA Line Outputs 1 to 8** Connect the line outputs of the e38 DAC to the amplifier RCA line inputs.

Trigger Output

When the e68 DAC is on, a 12 VDC signal is sent from the Trigger Output to control other devices. When the e68 is placed in standby mode, the trigger signal is discontinued.

Direct Connection to Analogue Power Amplifier

If your music sources are digital, you don't need a preamplifier. The built-in volume control allows analogue power amplifiers to be connected directly to the e68 DAC. Amplification always brings some level of noise and distortion. Eliminating unnecessary amplification helps to achieve higher level of transparency.



Avoid connecting the e68 DAC to receivers or any other sound processing equipment that perform analogue to digital (ADC) conversion. Digitizing the analogue output signals back to the digital domain will undo some of the benefits that e68 brings to you. Remember that your sound system is as good as the weakest link in the sound processing chain.

Connecting the Power Supply

To minimize ground noise and hum, it is recommended to connect the power cords of all components to a single point - usually a single surge protector with multiple outlets. Connecting all components to a single point, as close as it is practically possible minimizes the differences in ground potentials between the components.

Using a Third-Party Power Supply



The e68 DAC comes with a 12V/1670mA power supply. It has been tested to comply with the DAC's quality requirements and allows for very high performance.

If you decide to use another power supply, the specifications marked on the back of the e68 DAC must be observed.

Surge Protectors

We strongly recommend the use of surge protectors for all of your audio and video components.

Isolating the Cable TV Ground

If you have a cable TV connected to your audio system, ensure that the TV cable ground is galvanically isolated from the audio system ground. The TV cable ground, usually connected to the earth outside your home, can have a significantly different potential than the audio ground. This condition can cause audible hum. If you suspect this is the case, use a cable TV ground isolator just before the cable set-top box or at the RF TV input.



When turning on and off your sound system, the power amplifier should be the last component to be turned on and the first component to be turned off. This prevents power on/off transients from being transmitted to the loudspeakers.






- 1. Don't connect the e68 DAC to the PC until the driver is installed. Don't worry if you've connected the device already. Just disconnect it.
- 2. Use the username / password that we've emailed you with the shipping confirmation email to login to support.exasound.com.
- 3. Download the latest driver. Don't use setup packages downloaded from other websites.
- 4. Unzip the installation package and double-click on *exaSoundN1-5-3-39-Setup.exe*. (The driver version may be higher). Follow the instructions. In most cases you just need to accept the defaults on the following screens.









- 5. Connect the USB cable between the e68 DAC and the computer.
- 6. Upon completion of the Windows ASIO driver installation you will see the exaSound Dashboard Icon in the System Tray area next to the clock.




7. If you don't see it, right-click on the clock and select *Taskbar Settings* from the menu.



8. On the Taskbar Settings window click on *Select Which Icons Appear on the Taskbar*.



9. Scroll down to the exaSound e68 Dashboard icon and set the toggle to *On*.



- 10. You should be able to see the exaSound e68 Dashboard icons at all times. The Icon changes to indicate playback, and displays an exclamation mark when the USB cable is disconnected:
 - exaSound Dashboard
 - Playback is stopped
 - Playback in progress
 - The USB cable is disconnected
- 11. Close all programs and reboot Windows. Some ASIO players may not recognise the driver if you omit this step. If you don't restart Windows you may get an error message: "Hardware not present".






Before turning your amplifiers ON, always check the e68 DAC front panel to make sure that the volume level is safe.

- The e68 DAC can be controlled from the front panel buttons, using an IR remote control or from the computer screen.
- Make sure that all cables are connected. Turn on the unit using the *Power* button on the front
 panel or the remote control. The front panel display will light up.
- Click on the exaSound e68 Dashboard Icon in the System Tray area next to the clock.



• You will see the exaSound e68 Dashboard window.



• During playback the current sampling rate and stream format are displayed under the master volume slider.

- You can customize the channel labels: Select a label with the mouse and edit the channel title. Press *Enter* to save or *Cancel* to undo the change.
- Use the arrow button between the right channel and the master volume to toggle between
 Channel View and Minimised View.
- Use the **X** button in the top right corner to minimize the exaSound Dashboard window.

JRiver / JRemote Volume Synchronization Plug-in - Windows

The exaSound Volume Synchronization Plug-in allows JRiver for Windows and JRemote to access the hardware volume control built in all exaSound DACs.

- Moving the JRemote or JRiver volume slider changes the master volume slider on the exaSound Dashboard.
- Changing the master volume with the exaSound Dashboard adjusts the JRemote / JRiver volume sliders.

Installation Instructions:

- 1. Run the exaSound plug-in Setup.
- 2. Restart JRiver.
- 3. You will see the exaSound plug-in listed in JRiver under Services & Plug-ins. Select exaSound and use the checkbox to enable or disable volume synchronization.
- 4. For best results set JRiver to System Volume or Application Volume mode.
- Click on the Volume Options icon on the left side of the volume slider and select Enable Volume When Bitstreaming.

Roon Volume Synchronization Plug-in - Windows

The Roon Volume Synchronization Plug-in allows Roon for Windows to access the hardware volume control built in all exaSound DACs.

- Moving the Roon volume slider changes the master volume slider on the exaSound Dashboard.
- Changing the master volume with the exaSound Dashboard adjusts the Roon volume slider.

Installation Instructions:

- 1. Download and unzip exaSound-Roon-Volume-Plugin-Setup.zip.
- 2. Double-click exaSoundRoonVolumePlugin Setup 1.0.1.msi to start the setup and follow the instructions
- 3. You will see the icon of the exaSound Volume Plug-in for Roon on the system tray (next to the clock).
- 4. Start Roon and from the menu go to Settings. Click on the Extensions tab.


- 5. You should see the exaSound Volume Plug-in in the list of discovered extensions.
- 6. Click on the Audio tab in the Roon Settings window.
- 7. From the list of local audio zones find a zone configured for use with an exaSound ASIO driver.
- 8. Click or tap the settings icon for the zone and select Device Setup.
- 9. Open the Volume Control drop-down and select exaSound Volume: ASIO.
- 10. Tap or click on the Save button at the bottom of the Settings window.
- 11. From the list of local zones select an audio zone configured for use with exaSound ASIO driver.
- 12. Try changing the Roon volume. You should see the volume level changes on the display of your exaSound DAC.

Settings Menu - Windows

- Right-click on the exaSound icon on the system tray next to the clock. From the pop-up menu select Settings. You can also display the menu by right-clicking on the background area of the Dashboard.
- Use the Max Volume setting to prevent accidental playback at volume levels that are too loud.
- The e68 DAC automatically turns itself off after a period of inactivity. Use the *Power Off Timeout* setting to adjust the time interval before shutdown.

Software Installation

- 1. Don't connect the e68 DAC to your Mac until the driver is installed. Don't worry if you've connected the device already. Just disconnect it.
- 1. Use the username / password that we've emailed you with the shipping confirmation email to login to support.exasound.com.
- 2. Download the latest version of the exaSound Drivers Installer for Mac OS. Don't use setup packages downloaded from other websites.
 - Locate the installation package *exaSound-OS-X-Drivers-5-3-40.zip* in your *Downloads* folder. (The version number at the end of the file name may be higher.)
 - Double-click it. A Finder window will pop-up and you will see exaSound-OS-X-Drivers-5-3-40.pkg highlighted.
 - Double-click *exaSound-OS-X-Drivers-5-3-40.pkg* and follow the prompts. You just need to accept the defaults on the following screens. At the end of the installation your Mac will reboot.



2. Locate the exaSound Dashboard icon on the menu bar. The red exclamation mark indicates that the USB cable is disconnected:



3. Connect the USB cable of the exaSound DAC. The red exclamation mark should disappear from the exaSound Dashboard icon.



4. Power on the DAC. The red square overlay on the exaSound Dashboard icon indicates that the device is *On* and playback is stopped.




5. During playback the red square changed to a green triangle.




6. Click on the exaSound Dashboard icon and make sure that Core Audio is checked.



7. Go to *Applications -> Utilities* and open *Audio MIDI Setup*. Select the exaSound driver. By default the driver is set to 2-channel (Stereo) mode. Select 8ch-32-bit Integer.



8. Make the exaSound driver the default sound output device.



9. Make sure that the volume is set to less than -25db. At this point you are ready to play music.


Before turning your amplifiers ON, always check the e68 DAC front panel to make sure that the volume level is below -25dB.




Please follow the safety measures below strictly. It is quite common to set the volume on your Mac to maximum. You should never do this when your e68 DAC is connected to a powerful amplifier. Playing music or sound effects at maximum level is dangerous for your health and may damage your audio equipment.

Please note that the e68 DAC will match the volume level of your Mac when it is turned on. This may cause unexpected volume level rising.

- The e68 DAC can be controlled from the front panel buttons, using an IR remote control or from the Mac screen.
- Make sure that your power amplifier is turned off.
- Make sure that all cables are connected.
- Turn on the unit using the *Power* button on the front panel or the remote control. The front
 panel display will light up. After powering on the last used input is selected by default. Select the *USB Input*.



• Lower the volume to at least -25 db. The volume on the e68 DAC can be controlled from the Mac screen, from the device front panel, or with the infrared remote control.




Audio-MIDI Setup App

- Make sure that the desired volume level is displayed on the DAC front panel.
- Turn on your power amplifier.

Settings Menu - Mac OS

- Click on the exaSound icon on the Menu and select Settings.
- Use the Max Volume setting to prevent accidental playback at volume levels that are too loud.
- The e68 DAC automatically turns itself off after a period of inactivity. Use the *Power Off Timeout* setting to adjust the time interval before shutdown.



Using the exaSound ASIO Drivers for Mac OS

Make sure that the player app is configured for ASIO output. Click on the exaSound Dashboard icon. By default the *Input* is set to *Core Audio*. Select *ASIO*.

Note: When ASIO mode is selected, you won't be able to use the exaSound Core Audio driver.



At the present time ASIO on Mac OS is supported only by Roon and HQPlayer 3.

Volume Control

The e68 DAC volume is controlled by the ES9038PRO DAC chip. It is completely independent from the Windows and Mac software volume controls and it preserves the maximum possible signal to noise ratio.

The volume level changes in steps of 0.5 dB. At first power on, the volume level is set to -40dB. When the dashboard is closed it remembers the last used volume level.

On the Windows platform use the sliders on the exaSound Dashboard to control the volume for individual channels and the master volume. The sliders can be controlled in several ways:

- By left-clicking and dragging a slider.
- By positioning the mouse cursor over a channel and turning the mouse wheel. When the mouse cursor is rested over the channel area the background color changes to indicate that the channel is active.
- By selecting a channel with the mouse and using the *Up* and *Down* arrow keys on the keyboard.

On Mac use the volume slider on the Menu, the Audio-midi Setup App or the volume slider of the player app.

The master volume can also be controlled from the e68 front panel or by using a remote control. When the master volume level is changed, the value displayed on the exaSound Dashboard, the Audio-MIDI Setup app and on the device display are synchronised.

Volume levels for individual channels can be controlled from the exaSound Dashboard on Windows and the Audio-MIDI Setup app on Mac.

The sound can be muted by clicking the *Mute* button under the master volume slider or by using the remote control. Pressing or clicking *Mute* again restores the previous volume level. Pressing *Volume Up* or *Volume Down* will cancel the mute state.

Note: Level indicators on the Windows Dashboard are inactive in DSD mode.

Volume Bypass

When the volume sliders on the exaSound Dashboard or the Audio-MIDI Setup app are set to 0dB, the hardware volume control is turned off and the e68 DAC operates in Volume Bypass Mode.

To activate Volume Bypass:

- Set the master volume slider to 0dB.
- Set the left and right volume sliders to 0dB.
- Make sure that your player is not changing the volume level.


Playing Music from SPDIF Sources

The e68 DAC makes it possible to enjoy greatly improved level of sonic clarity and fidelity from stereo SPDIF sources. The sonic improvement is the result of the outstanding jitter cancelling capability, superb signal to noise ratio, and low distortion levels of the e68 DAC.

You can connect up to two SPDIF devices, such as disk players and wireless music servers.

To use SPDIF sources:

- Select SPDIF input by pressing the *Input* button on the device front panel, by using the *Previous Input / Next Input* buttons on the remote control or with the *Input Selector* on the exaSound Dashboard.
- 2. The e68 front panel display will flash a *Changing Input* message.
- 3. The e68 front panel will display information about the input in use, the current sampling rate, and the master volume level.



Automatic Power On/Off

- The e68 DAC has an automatic power-on function and it will turn itself on when playback is initiated.
- The e68 DAC can be configured to automatically turn itself off after a period of inactivity. Use the Power Off Timeout setting to adjust the inactivity time interval before shutdown.

IR Remote Control Setup

The e68 DAC is configured to work with the supplied remote control. If you like, you can reprogram the se68 DAC to work with a different IR remote control. The exaSound e68 DAC can learn to recognise commands from most infrared remote controls using Sony and NEC IR protocols.

Use the following procedure to change remote control button assignments or to pair the e68 DAC with a different remote control:

- 1. Power on the e68 DAC. Make sure that the unit is not in playback mode.
- 2. Press the Setup button.
- Press the *Volume Up* button to confirm the remote control learning mode, or press the *Volume Down* button to cancel the operation.

vol+ -> Set rem vol- -> Cancel

- 4. Point the remote control to the e68 DAC display. Press and hold down the remote control buttons for about one second during each step below to assign functions to them.
- 5. Press the remote control button for increasing the volume.
- 6. Press the remote control button for decreasing the volume.
- 7. Press the remote control button for selecting the next input.
- 8. Press the remote control button for previous input.
- 9. Press the remote control button for turning the unit on and off.
- 10. Press the remote control button for mute.
- 11. Press the remote control button for turning the display light on and off.
- 12. Wait until the remote control configuration is saved. Your e68 DAC is now paired for use with the new IR remote control.
